Holiday Safety Tip Reminders

Captains Message: With the Holidays quickly approaching, I wanted to reach out to all of you who work so diligently with District Three to improve the quality of life of all who live, work, visit and play in the district. I also want to extend a personal thank you while wishing everyone Happy Holidays.

I want to use this opportunity to review some preventive tips related to personal safety and property security. My intention with this message is to remind all of you that District Three personnel truly care about the security of your property and your personal safety.

Personal Safety Tips:

- Be aware of your surroundings
- When out at night, try to have a friend walk with you.
- Carry only the money you'll need on a particular day.

- Don't display your cash or any other inviting targets such as pagers, cell phones, hand-held electronic games, or expensive jewelry and clothing.
- Try to park in well-lighted areas with good visibility and close to walkways, stores, and people.
- Make eye contact with persons around you.
- If someone tries to rob you, give up your property.
- If you are robbed or assaulted, report the crime to the police. Try to describe the attacker accurately. Your actions can help prevent someone else from becoming a victim.

Property Safety Tips:

- Place items in your trunk before you reach your destination-
- ALWAYS remove loose valuables from your vehicle. This includes purses, wallets, loose change, clothing, cellular phones, laptop

computers, and briefcases.

- Record serial #s, model, & brand of valuables. Stolen property can't be lawfully reclaimed unless it can be identified.
- Keep house and car keys on separate key chains. When leaving your car for service or at a lot, leave only the car keys.
- If a stranger asks to use your telephone, do not let them. Offer to call for assistance for them.
- Keep an eye out for each other and report suspicious activity.
